I Alex Gurza declare as follows:

1. I am a Deputy City Manager and the Director of the Office of Employee Relations

in the City Manager's Office for the City of San Jose (hereinafter, "City"). I submit this

1 implementation of the above referenced sections of Measure B, either through the enactment of
2 ordinances or otherwise.

3 **Retirement System Actions re the Supplemental Retiree Benefit Reserve**

4 5. As part of their Motion for Preliminary Injunction, plaintiffs seek a preliminary
5 injunction against Section 1511-A of Measure B, which among other things returns the funds in
6 the Supplemental Retiree Benefit Reserve ("SRBR") to the general retirement funds.

7 6. In its initial opposition to the Motion, the City presented a memorandum from staff
8 of the Federated Retirement Plan, which informed the Federated Board that the return of the funds
9 to the general retirement fund involved only an accounting entry (since the funds were already
10 combined for investment purposes), that the accounting entry would not be made until June 30,
11 2013, and that this entry could be reversed. (See Declaration of Jennifer Schembri, Exh. 1) The
12 accounting entry affects the rate used to calculate the City's contribution to the retirement plan.

13 7. At the time, the Police and Fire Retirement Board had not yet determined what
14 action to take in connection with the Police and Fire Retirement System SRBR. At the March 7,
15 2013, public meeting of the Police and Fire Retirement System, the Board decided to take the
16 SRBR funds into account in setting the City's contribution rate for the upcoming fiscal year, and
17 was informed by staff that its inclusion of the SRBR funds with the general retirement funds, for
18 this purpose, could be reversed if necessary. A copy of the Meeting Agenda, and transcript for
19 that portion of the meeting, are attached herein as Exhibits B and C.

20 I declare under penalty of perjury under the laws of the State of California that the
21 foregoing is true and correct and that I executed this declaration on March 13, 2013 in San Jose,
22 California.

Dear Counsel:

Given that we have a trial date of June 17, 2013, and after consultation with the City about its timeline for implementation of Measure B, we are proposing the attached stipulation to govern the effective dates of various provisions of Measure B. Under the City's projected timeline, most provisions of Measure B would not have any possible impact prior to January 1, 2014.

The City is proposing this stipulation at this time to enable the parties and the Court to focus on trial, and in light of the practical reality that the City must prepare for implementation before many provisions of Measure B can become effective. We are copying Judge Kirwan to inform him about the City's timeline and this proposed stipulation in advance of the March 15, 2013 hearing.



IMPLEMENTATION OF MEASURE B IN
CONNECTION WITH TRIAL SET FOR
JUNE 17, 2013**

Complaint Filed: June 6, 2012

22 WHEREAS, a court trial has been set for June 17, 2013, in these consolidated actions
23 concerning various provisions of San Jose Charter Sections 1500-A, et seq., known as "Measure
24 B";

25 WHEREAS, the parties desire to focus on preparation for trial and judicial resolution of
26 the claims made in plaintiffs' complaints;

27 WHEREAS, the parties desire to avoid unnecessary litigation during trial preparation, trial
28 and judicial consideration of this matter;

1 WHEREAS, the City expects that the process for implementing Measure B will occur over
2 a period of several months;

3 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED by and among the parties in these consolidated actions that
4 the implementation by the City of San Jose of the following sections of Measure B, San Jose
5 Charter Sections 1500-A, et seq., shall be subject to the following agreement.

6 1. The effective date for implementation of Section 1506-A (additional employee
7 contribution rates), section 1507-A (one time voluntary election program) and section 1514-A
8 (savings) shall occur no sooner than January 1, 2014.

9 2. The effective date for implementation of Section 1512-A (a) (minimum
10 contributions towards the cost of retiree healthcare) shall occur no sooner than January 1, 2014,
11 but shall be subject to any union agreements, or City resolutions, that specify employee
12 contributions towards retiree healthcare, in existence on January 1, 2014.

13 3. The effective date for implementation of Section 1510-A (emergency measures to
14 contain retiree cost of living adjustments) shall occur no sooner than January 1, 2014. The parties
15 note that there are no current plans by the City to declare an emergency or to adopt emergency
16 measures.

17 4. The effective date for implementation of Section 1509-A (disability retirements)
18 shall occur no sooner than January 1, 2014.

19 5. The effective date for implementation of Section 1515-A (severability) shall occur
20 no sooner than January 1, 2014.

21 6. This stipulation sets forth an agreement concerning effective dates of various
22 sections of Measure B. It does not preclude the City from preparing for implementation of the
23 above referenced sections of Measure B, either through the enactment of ordinances or otherwise.


